The game will be "stratified" so you will have a chance to earn masterpoints based on how well you do compared with other players in your "strat." A stratified game is a type of game movement where all players are assigned to a group (strat) based on their current masterpoint holdings. Each contestant plays against players of all point ranges. Masterpoints are awarded to leaders of each strat. If a Strat C player scored better than one of the leaders in Strat B (a higher ranked strat), the C player will be awarded the points for Strat B. ♦

## ACBL's Instant MP Game

The 2003 ACBL Instant Matchpoint Game will be held at bridge clubs across the country on Wednesday evening, September 10.

The contest features a gold point for section top winners (each direction). The game also features a

booklet with complete analyses of the deals by many-time national champion Richard Pavlicek. The ACBL Instant Matchpoint Game is the only club event awarding gold points.

There will be two contests—an Open Championship and a Secondary Contest. The Open Championship is for games with at least five full tables run in a Mitchell movement. All pairs in the Open Championship games must play exactly 24 boards to be eligible for the prizes. Open events with 14 or more tables may split into games of at least seven tables each and award gold points to section winners in each direction.

Other awards are half red, half black. In stratified games, only those pairs placing first in the “open” field are eligible for gold points. Invitational games will be considered secondary contests and will award .80 gold points for section-top winners in Mitchell movements of five or more tables.

The Secondary Contest must have at least six pairs. All games with half tables are considered secondary games. Howell movements will also be considered secondary contests. Howell winners will be considered to be in the North-South field. ♠

## Director's Corner

During the game one recent Thursday, Director Peggy Jett gave a new insight into the troubles of directing a bridge game. Peggy announced that no one should move until she called the round, quoting the universal director's motto: “No one is a higher authority, except God, when I am directing.” Fast players are just as irritating as the slow players, and both are irritating.

Hovering about because you finish a round early is as much a distraction to the game as being the last to finish a round. Please try to maintain a tempo to your play that does not delay the game. And, conversely, please remain in your seat until the director announces the move. Be assured, the director will call the move.

Remember also that the directors come an hour early to set up the game. They are the first to come and the last to leave. They set up the coffee, set out the ice, fill the water jugs, make sure the room is ready, take out the trash, take the money, enter the names, enter the scores, run off your personal recaps, post the scores, clean up the room, take out the trash, etc., etc. But they are not your maids. Be sure to clean up your own messes. Your spilled food, empty cups, and pulled out chairs should not have to be the work of the director. If you kibitz, be sure to return your chair to its proper

You could also show your appreciation to these hard workers by helping take out the trash, empty the coffee grounds, and picking up the trash (that of course no one will be leaving now). Remember also that the director has a whole room of people to keep happy. Do not complain constantly to the director. It is tiring to deal with difficult people. There is always someone who is

too hot and someone who is too cold, someone thinks the rounds are going too slow while someone thinks the rounds are going too fast, someone can't stand it because they are being cheated of their time for the next round because they are playing against a slow player, and someone thinks they are being cheated of their time because they have a slow player coming to their table. If you are a slow player and can't stand the noise as you are finishing your last hand, play faster!!

## STaC Games September 22-28

“STaC” is an abbreviation for a special kind of sectional tournament know as a Sectional Tournament at Clubs. It offers sectional rating and is played in a number of clubs in a specific area over a period of several days. The results of all games are sent to one location, which is manned by the director-in-charge of the event. Overall pair game awards are determined by comparing the results of all games conducted at a particular session just as if all of the games were played at one

site. The masterpoints awarded in this type of tournament are silver points. All games the week of September 22–28 will be STaC games. ♥
