### Special Games in June

There are several opportunities for earning extra points at the Bridge House during June. Make a special effort to get a partner to play in these games.

#### Friday, June 4—World Wide Pairs

The Worldwide Bridge Contest allows matchpointing across the world. This annual international competition will be held at the Bridge House on Friday, June 4, at 7:30 p.m. It is scored as usual at the local level and matchpointed around the world at the world level.

ACBL masterpoints are awarded at sectional open pair rating, half red and half black. The World Bridge Federation will award prizes based on the world matchpointing. The two top district winners by percentage receive bonus awards.

#### North American Pairs Qualifying Games—Various Dates

The North American Pairs (NAP) starts at the club level and is divided into three flights based on masterpoint

### Unit 161 Masterpoint Races

The Mini-McKenney races were established in 1974 by the ACBL Board of Directors to recognize the calendar year masterpoint achievements of all players at each level of achievement (Rookie, Junior Master, etc.). To recognize calendar year achievement just at the club level, the Ace of Clubs competition was created in 1984. All points won at the club level are counted in the Ace of Clubs contest with the exception of those won in STaCs, progressive sectionals, NABC fund-raiser events, the North American Open Pairs, and the Grand National Teams. Both the Mini-McKenney and Ace of Clubs champions are recognized at the unit level and ACBL-wide. At May 14, 2004, several LRDBC members were ranked in the Unit 161 Mini-McKenney and Ace of Clubs races for 2004.

totals. Stage 1 A Club Qualifying games are held at the club level in June, July, and August. Consult the schedule on page 5 to see when qualifying games will be held at the Bridge House during June. Stage 2 A Unit Qualifying will be held after September 1 and before the district finals. Stage 3 A District Qualifying is the last stage that determines the top three pairs in each category (Open/2000/500) which advance to the National Finals at the spring NABC. Winners of each flight receive reimbursement for airfare and hotels, with other awards available.

### June 21–June 27—Sectional Tournament at Club (STaC)

Sectional Tournament at Club games are scheduled at each regular session the week of June 21–June 27. The Monday night and Wednesday morning games will be restricted as usual but the Thursday night game will be open to all players. STaC games provide bridge players with the opportunity to win Silver Points at their local club.

## Counting and Visualization

### Allan Siebert

Counting is absolutely essential to play effective bridge!!!! You must visualize hands from the bidding and counting in declarer play and on defense to be effective!!!

Vul: E–W

Dir: N

♠ x x  
♥ A Q 10  
♦ J 9 8 x  
♣ Q J 10 x

Opening Lead: ♠3, ?

Analysis: You should start out in declarer play (just as you do in defending) by visualizing all hands from the bidding. It looks like East probably had 5 spades to the ♠K and most of the 14 HCPs left, but maybe not all. One thing is for sure—he will only be missing at most one key high card, maybe an Ace or a King. So you now plan your play by first counting your winners: 2 spades, 3 hearts, 1 or no diamonds, and 3 or 4 clubs. Since West cannot have but one key card you must be able to win 9 tricks. Now the only thing left to do is to play safe and not let East get in after spades have been cleared, which could only happen if you took the club finesse and lost to West and he cleared the spades. East could then get in with the ♦A and cash 3 more spades. So with that in mind, first play a diamond toward your ♦K and if that loses to West then East must have the ♣K and you still get your 9 tricks that way.

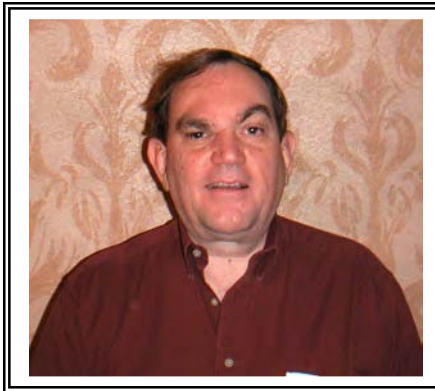

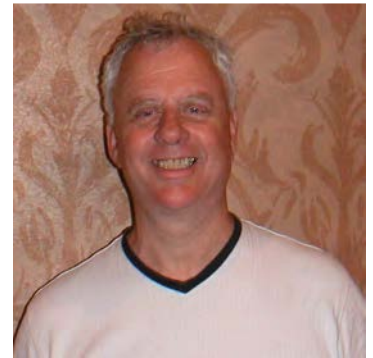
